## Language

Moving to Taiwan will be much easier if you have a grasp of Mandarin or Taiwanese. It is not necessary, but having just a little understanding of the languages will open many more opportunities for you during your stay in Taiwan. Living in the larger cities it will be easy to find ex-pat groups to learn the ins and outs of your locale. If you live in a rural area there will surely be a couple people that will be able to speak some English, but it will not be as common as the cities.

#### Language Exchange

This is very simple as you are a commodity here in Taiwan. Your English is in demand, and the supply of English is not really abundant. Therefore, finding someone that wants to trade English/Chinese classes is usually quite simple. You will meet many people that will keep it more informal as a friendship. They will want to get to know you and teach you about their culture while learning some English from you. You will often be pleasantly surprised by the random person that speaks English amazingly well. Anywhere from your taxi driver to students sitting next to you on the train.

#### Language Cont'd

Putting in some solid study during your downtime hours at school can have you passing an intermediate level examination in Mandarin before the first year is complete. Passing this exam opens doors to many employment opportunities. Taiwan "guan xi" is very important. Making friends and connections will afford you opportunities that you would just not be privy to if you don't speak the language. I highly recommend getting to low level intermediate Mandarin if you have the time and you have any desire to lengthen your time spent working in Taiwan.

#### School

The school you teach at is where you will spend 33% of your week. Take stock in your surroundings. What do you like about your school? Is there anything you don't like about your school?

Personally, I loved my previous position at Ji'An elementary school. It is small, quaint, and right beneath the mountains. The classes were 23-25 students and they were all well mannered. The staff was delightful and outgoing. I loved this position so much more than the city schools that I would take a pay cut to teach there.

This year of teaching at your school should be a benefit to both the students you are teaching and yourself as well. Take the time to see what you like about your school. Evaluate what you can suggest or do to make your time there more eventful and productive. This is a great experience for you going forward. You have the opportunity to watch and gain from other teachers abilities or strategies. If you feel so inclined, you can most likely get more involved in planning and implementing of teaching philosophies, curriculum planning, outcome based goals, and evaluations in your classes.

#### Co-Workers

You will find that Taiwanese people are generally very, very cordial and helpful. They tend to go the extra step to make you feel welcome and comfortable. The more you interact and reciprocate, like anything in life, the more you will become

part of the team and have a feeling of inclusion.
